The challenge we face.

- (!) 1 in 3 families in Wake County has to decide between food and diapers.
- (!) Hygiene items such as diapers are classified as "luxury items" and not covered by federal programs such as SNAP or WIC.
- (!) Since the COVID-19 pandemic, requests for diapers in NC have increased 400%.*

diapers distributed (42% increase from 2021)

8,668

children/families served (22% increase from 2021)

The community that made it possible:

825

total donors (39% increase from 2021) 967

volunteer sign-ups (17.5% increase from 2021) 1,907

volunteer hours (35% increase from 2021) Before our partnership with Diaper Train, the Center spent 35% of our annual budget on diapers. Having access to diapers means:

- Access to daycare (diapers are required!)
- More money for other resources, such as food and gas
- Improved mental and physical well-being for the entire family

- Fewer missed days of work
- Healthier, happier babies
- Reduced stress on caregivers, resulting in fewer cases of domestic violence

A diaper can change a life. Ty is a mother of four who has firsthand experience with diaper poverty. She used to have to stretch out diapers the best she could, and where budgeting with four children was already stressful, emergencies presented even more of a challenge. **Having diapers as another expense, on top of all the other challenges of motherhood, made life complicated.**

Through the referral of a caseworker, Ty came to Diaper Train after the birth of her second child. There, she was met with the support and compassion of our helpful volunteers. Ty described Diaper Train as a beautiful blessing for her children—*one of whom is still served by us!*
