We've made remarkable progress in our mission, distributing more than 878,000 diapers to families in need. Since our founding, we've provided over 7 million diapers across the county—numbers that reflect the profound impact we've been able to make, thanks to the generosity of our community. This year, Diaper Train also experienced great internal growth. In addition to my onboarding as the Executive Director, we have welcomed four new board members and a Development Manager to our team. 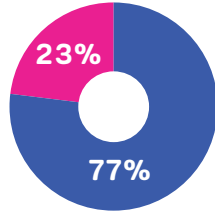

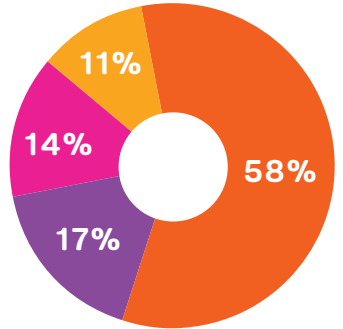

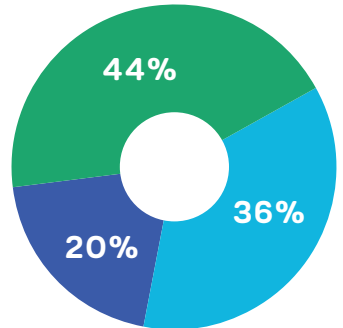

Why Access Matters

Without clean diapers babies are exposed to potential health risks and toxic stress.

Mothers are at risk for increased maternal depression.

Parents are unable to access child care, which requires a daily supply of diapers.

Parents then miss out on work or school, leading to missed economic opportunity.

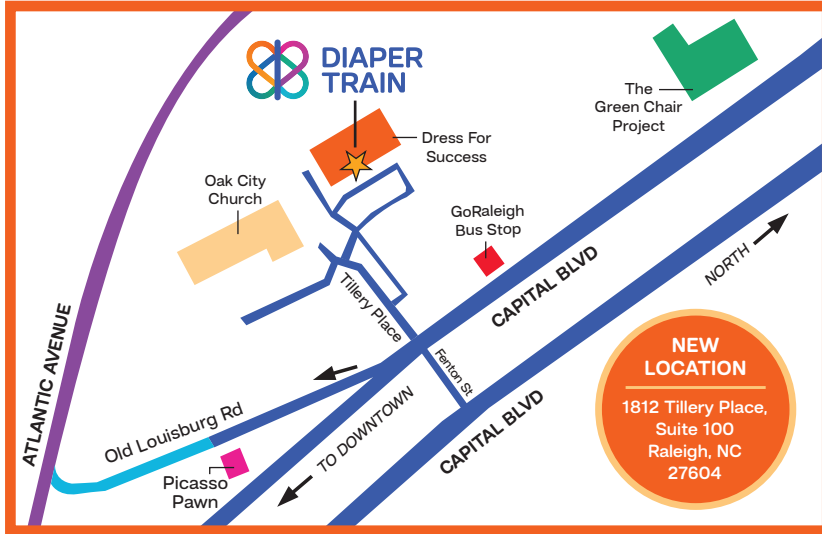
